

Today, across America, there's a movement from cities across our great nation to remove Columbus Day as a National holiday and replace it with Indigenous People's Day. Sadly, this movement has made gains in succeeding to make this change. My Brothers and Sisters, it's time to stand up and be counted.

Now is the time to start planning ahead to put programs together for October. Seek to place displays in your local library. Visit your City or Town Mayor or Commissioners to seek a proclamation for Columbus Day. Take photos of your displays and proclamations. Visit your local newspapers and request to place articles and photos of each of these events. We can't wait for the next one of us to get involved. WE are

the next one. Let us move forward as one always remembering that we recall our past with pride, honor the present with joy, creating the future with hope.

istorically, names have served as a fingerprint of life, perhaps a basic clue to one's personality. The intriguing story of surnames dates back thousands of years. The oldest testimonies can be traced back to ancient China where, according to legend, the use of surnames began 3,000 years B.C. How and where they began, what they originally meant and their various spellings, is called the study of "onomastics".

The Romans had three names in this order: *Praenomen* (given name), *Nomen* (gens or clan) and *Cognomen* (family name). During the early Middle Ages, people were referred to by a single given name. But gradually the custom of adding another name, to distinguish individuals, gained popularity. Certain distinct traits became commonly used as a part of this practice. For instance:

- The place of birth Leonardo Da Vinci, St. Francis of Assisi;
- A descriptive characteristic Lambert Le Tort (twisted);
- The person's occupation: Pier Plowman;
- Or the use the father's name: Leif Ericsson (the son of Eric).



ORIGIN OF SURNAMES

By the 12th century, the use of a second name had become so widespread that in some places it was considered vulgar not to have one. The modern hereditary use of surnames is a practice that originated among the Venetians aristocracy in Italy about the 10th century. This custom soon spread throughout Europe. Beginning in the 15th and 16th centuries, family names gained in popularity in Poland and Russia. The Scandinavian countries, bound by their customs of using the father's name as second name, didn't begin using surnames until the 19th century. Turkey waited until 1933 when the government forced the practice on its people. Governments came to rely more on surnames for written records as it became necessary to identify individuals accurately. We can be certain that by 1450 most people, of whatever social rank, had a fixed, hereditary surname. This surname identified the family, provided a link with the family past, and would preserve its identity in the future. It became a matter of family pride. It was a cause of much regret if a man had no male descendants to whom he could pass on the surname he himself had inherited and had borne with pride.

The first permanent names were those of barons and landowners who derived their names from their manors, lands or fiefs but the practice trickled down to merchants and commoners. Family names have come down to us in various ways. They may have grown out of a person surrounding or job, or the name of an ancestor. Mainly, all surnames evolved from the following four general sources:

Location: Locational names were the first to become

hereditary.

Characteristics: Surnames from nicknames or descriptive

traits are also of early origin.

Occupation: Surnames taken from occupations came later.

Patronymic: Those of patronymics/matronymic origin

were the last to become hereditary.

Location (Geographical)

The John who lived over the hill became known as John Overhill; the one who dwelled near a stream might be dubbed John Brook. Many locational surnames originated as place-names. You can tell it's a locational name if it ends with *-hill*, *-ford*, *-wood*, *-brook*, *-well* and so on.

Characteristic

An unusually small person might be labeled Small, Short, or Little. A large man might be named Longfellow, Large, or Long. Many persons having characteristics of a certain animal would be given the name Fox (if he was sly), Fish (if he was a good swimmer), Dove (if he was a quiet man), etc. Surnames that are the most fun, the most surprising and sometimes even embarrassing, are the characteristic names. However, please remember that the definition may have been applied to someone who lived centuries ago. Redd might have been a person with red hairs and White, a person with white complexion of hair.

Occupation

Someone by the name of John who was a local house builder, a food preparer, a grain grinder or a suit maker, would be named respectively: John Carpenter, John Cook, John Miller or John Taylor. The person who made barrels was called Cooper. The blacksmith was called Smith. Every village had its share of Smiths and the Smiths in one town weren't necessarily related to the Smiths in the next.

Patronymic (father's name)

Many of these surnames can be recognized by the suffix or termination 'son', such as Williamson, Jackson, etc. Some endings used by other countries to indicate 'son' are the following: Armenians used 'ian' (Kevorkian, son of Kervok), Danes and Norwegians used 'sen' (Rasmussen, son of Rasmus), Finns

used 'nen' (Heikkinen, son of Heikki), Greeks used 'poulos' (Alexopoulos, son of Alex), Spaniards used 'ez' (Sanchez, son of Sancho), Portuguese used 's' (Rodrigues, son of Rodrigo), Russians used 'ov' (Ivanov, son of Ivan), 'off' (Romanoff, son of Romanus), and 'vich' (Petrovich, son of Petrus). The Poles used 'wski' (Piotrowski, son of Pieter).

Not only suffixes but there are prefixes denoting 'son'. The Welsh used 'Ap'. In Wales, David, the son of John tacked 'Ap' in front of his father's name, and David ApJohn was soon being called David Upjohn. The Scots used 'Mac' or 'Mc'. In Scotland, the descendants on an individual named Gilleain were known as MacGilleain and later shortened to MacLean or McLane and other versions. The Irish used 'O'. In Ireland, John O'Connor meant the son or grandson of Connor. The Normans used 'Fitz'. So, John, the son of Randolph became John Fitz-Randolph because 'fitz' means 'son of'. It comes to mind president Kennedy (JFK), whose middle name was Fitzgerald, his mother Rose's family name. Even though patronymic names have been in use a long time, many centuries ago they would change with every generation: William's son, John, would be known as John Williamson, while his son William would be named William Johnson.


