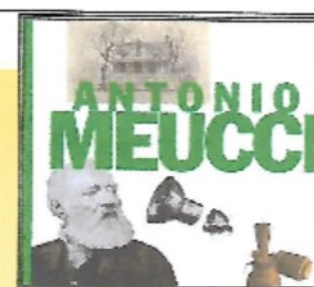
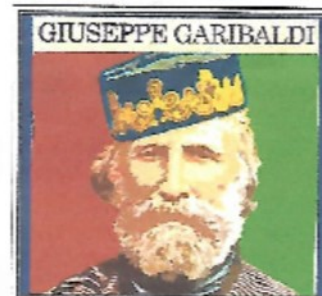

VETERANS ABLE TO SHOP AT MILITARY EXCHANGE

The Department of Defense announced that effective Veterans Day, November 11, 2017, all Honorably Discharged Veterans of the military will have limited on line shopping privileges at military exchanges. Please note privileges exclude the purchase of uniforms, alcohol and tobacco products. All purchases are tax free along with free delivery on purchased items. GARIBALDI MEUCCI MUSEUM

How many of my Brothers and Sisters are aware that our Order of Sons of Italy in America owns a Museum? The museum, located at 420 Tompkins Avenue, Staten Island, N.Y. is owned by the Sons of Italy Foundation and is administered by the Grand Lodge of New York Board of Commissioners. The museum, built in 1845, was formally turned over to the Sons of Italy in 1919. The building opened as a museum in 1956 and is open from Wednesday through Sunday from 1pm to 5pm. Italian language classes are available at two 15 week classes. Guided tours are also available. In 1980, the museum was listed in the United States Register of Historic places.

The current name of the museum came about due to the fact that Antonio Meucci, born in Italy in 1908, the inventor of the telephone in 1850, moved to the house in 1850 with his wife Esterre after migrating from Italy via Cuba. Meucci attempted to obtain a patent for his phone but lacked funds to do so. In 1871, he was seriously injured in a ferry accident and as he lacked funds his wife sold his telephone models for \$6.00. Upon his recovery he rebuilt his telephone but was again unable to obtain a patent due to the lack of funds. In 1876, Alexander Graham Bell patented the telephone. Meucci died in 1889.

On October 17, 2001, the United States House of Representatives passed HRES #269 IH and on June 11, 2002, passed HRES #289 EH resolutions declaring that the life and achievements of Antonio Meucci should be recognized, and his work in the invention of the telephone be acknowledged.

Meucci, after moving into the home hosted a dear friend, Giuseppe Garibaldi, who arrived from Italy to live with him. They worked together as candle makers. Garibaldi remained living with Meucci until 1853, when he returned to Italy to continue with his goal of the unification of Italy. Garibaldi led many military campaigns that brought about the unification of Italy. In 1861, he contacted President Abraham Lincoln and volunteered his services during the Civil War. He was invited to serve as a Major General in the Union Army. His famous command to his troops, "I offer you neither pay, nor food. I only offer hunger, thirst, forced marches, battles and death. Let him who loves his Country with his heart, and not with his lips, follow me."

He returned to Italy after the war, moved to Caprera and died on June 2, 1882.

WHAT AMERICANS THINK OF ITALIANS

Michela Gombacci writes for GRAZIA, an Italian weekly women's magazine. **What do Americans really think of Italians?** "Despite my seven years living in the USA between New York and Los Angeles and the countless trips I still make between Italy and America today, I feel like I have just realized, now that I am about to marry an Italian-American, what the Americans really think of us. And I mean what they think when they say "Oh the Italians" uttered almost with a sneer of satisfaction, referring to who knows what. Given that when I hear about us I always feel a strong pride come to life and I feel compelled to defend national peculiarities and why Americans are really perplexed about us Italians.

Eating dessert for breakfast. That's one of the weirdest things we do for them. They do not understand how, upon waking up, after a few imprecations as why it's again Monday, we do not get out of bed with the desire to pull out pan, butter and oil, cook eggs, fry bacon and sizzle sausages. In other words, how to gulp down at least 1500 calories when it's only 8.30 in the morning, while sipping a cappuccino. We are the strange ones, because we are simply satisfied with espresso, brioche and orange juice. The weirdos.

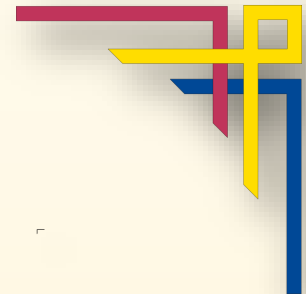
Shutting down for lunch break and the siesta, as they like to call it. They, hardened workers who are used to eating sandwiches with dubious contents in front of the computer, without even thinking about taking a coffee break, when they are in Italy and approach a shop at 12.29 and find it closed, shutters lowered with a sign: "*Chiuso*" or the shopkeeper tells them "Sorry but I've already closed the register, can you come back at 4 PM?" they can't help but sit on a bench in the sun and also enjoy a well-

deserved lunch break.

The air conditioned. The very strange thing that puzzles them is when we sit down with friends at the restaurant and by misfortune we happen to sit under the blowing freezing air from a nearby air conditioner. Promptly, snorting, we ask to change table or to turn down the damn blasting conditioner. Here, Americans are convinced that the *colpo d'aria* doesn't exist. I tried several times to explain what it is, convinced that maybe they had not grasped the concept: I speak about cervical problems, I make clumsy gestures to indicate where this misfortune of the air blow strikes you. But the strange thing is that there is no corresponding medical term, *having the cervical* is not considered a pathology. I explain that the cold air blast is one of the things you have to be careful about, in winter as well as in summer, such as not going out with wet hair, waiting two hours after eating before you can bathe, putting on a scarf when entering store on Fifth Avenue in NY, in the summer, when outside there are 100 degrees in the shade and inside pop-sicles form on coat hangers.

We don't know how to stand in line. Another difference that they cannot bear, is our inability to form a single row and wait our turn in public places. I was waiting to board a plane at JFK. There were still 30 minutes to go before boarding. As soon as the staff made the announcement for embarkation, I see a row of Americans, single file in front of the gate, slowly invaded by a storm of Italians who without following any precise order, business or priority, had spread out, occupying the gate, and why not, even the neighboring ones. I felt right at home. Ah, the Italians!"
